8. School meals information

Robin Hood Academy has a kitchen on site operated via our catering company, currently Caterlink. All food is cooked on site and the caterers produce a menu which is available to view on the website. The school also offers an option to bring packed lunches.

Children in Reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school meal. There is a charge of £2.20 for each meal in key stage 2. Lunches have to be taken for a term at a time. Payment is required in advance and can be made through the school office or via the Parent Pay payment system. The school operates a strict no debt policy and copies of the policy are available from the school offices and on the school website.

All pupils in both key stage 1 and key stage 2 can choose to bring a packed lunch to eat. We do encourage healthy lunches and have an information sheet to support with this. We advise that all packed lunches need to be considerate of pupils with allergies in school, particularly air borne allergies such as nuts.

Snacks

Children in Foundation and key stage 1 are provided with fruit every day at no cost. Children in the foundation stage are also entitled to free milk. Pupils in key stage 2 may also bring a healthy snack to eat at break time.

Free school meals

Your child might be eligible for free school meals if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

How do I register?

You only need to register once at the school.

9. Uniform

School uniform bearing the Robin Hood Academy logo can be purchased from the school office. Parents can of course purchase items from other providers, so long as the school colours are adhered to and the clothing is plain, without logos or other designs.

We strongly recommend that jewellery is not worn at all in school Only watches and stud earrings are permitted. Make-up is not to be worn in any circumstances. PE kits are worn all day on PE days. This means we do not need to change for sessions, maximising lesson time.



10. Illness and Absence

Please contact the school office before 9:30am on the morning of the first absence.

Please note that term time absence is not regularly authorised and is only permitted in exceptional circumstances.

Authorisation must be gained in advance of travel as the new DFE guidance in July 2019 stipulates authorisation can not be gained retrospectively.

Any medication needs will need to be discussed with Mrs Downs and Mrs Cunningham so please arrange an appointment via the school office.

11. Homework

Staff and pupils regard homework as an integral part of the curriculum – it is planned and prepared alongside all other programmes of learning.

Early Years:

In Early Years this may be supporting children with a tricky concept; phonics, rhymes and simple number games. Each week the 'Rhyme of the Week' is sent home with children for them to learn with their families. Books that match a child's reading age are also sent home and parents are encouraged to read with their child 'little and often'.

Key Stage One:

In Key Stage 1, reading forms the basis of learning at home. Ideally parents should read with or to their children every day to help them develop a love of reading. Books that match a child's reading age are sent home as well as a 'free choice' book, which also matches a child's reading age.

From year 2, children take part in Times Tables Rockstars. An engaging, competitive online game that improves times-table fluency.

Key Stage Two:

In Key Stage 2, at the start of each half term, topics and research projects are shared with the children. Children can direct their own learning based on their new topic. In addition, weekly homework is shared which links to the current Maths and English learning. Children are also expected to read a minimum of three times a week and visit the local library regularly. They have access to a variety of online English resources including Letterjoin for handwriting, Bug Club for reading and Spelling Shed for spelling.

16. Road Safety and Parking

The road outside the school, Pitmaston Road, is a residential street and can be exceptionally busy at drop off and collection times. The school highly recommends that all children are supervised into the school grounds due to the numbers of pedestrians and vehicles around at key times. This is especially important for pupils below year 5. Please support us by:

- Dropping pupils off on the zig zag lines outside of the school is discouraged as it places pupils in a dangerous position and can lead to traffic delays.
- Residents also ask us to please remind you to park considerately so that driveways are not used by parents of the school or blocked by cars.
- The car park based at the Toby Carvery on the Robin Hood Island can be used for parking and can accommodate many vehicles. This will reduce congestion in the road outside of the school.

17. Using Social Media

Robin Hood Academy embraces the positive impact and educational benefits that can be achieved through appropriate use of the Internet and associated communications technologies such as social media. We are also aware that inappropriate or misguided use can expose both adults and young people to unacceptable risks and dangers. To that end, we aim to provide a safe and secure environment which not only protects all people on the premises but also educates them on how to stay safe in the wider world.
