NO PHONE ZONE


Thank you to all of our families who have stopped using mobiles on our site following our campaign. Just a further reminder that the school is a NO PHONE ZONE. This is from the entrances to the school from Pitmaston Road onwards. We request that phone calls are made off site and phones are placed in pockets or bags once on the school site. This is part of our safeguarding of pupils and therefore, if you are using a device on school grounds, you will be approached by staff, or even pupils, to remind you of the rules. Team Protect have ordered new signs for the front gate.

There are devices used across the school by teaching staff for a variety of reasons such as collating assessments and as part of teaching groups. These are overseen by the school and are linked to the e-safety monitoring systems we have in place.
